

# Alums honored with awards

In a tradition of honoring distinguished alums of the university, OSU presented a variety of awards last week.

Al and Pat Reser of Beaverton, Ore., were honored with the prestigious Martin Chaves Lifetime Achievement Award at an awards banquet in Rancho Mirage, Calif., on Tuesday, March 4.

The annual award is presented to people who have made outstanding lifetime contributions to OSU Athletics.

The Resers have served on multiple OSU boards as volunteer leaders. Among other major donations to OSU, the Resers' gifts to expand OSU's football stadium reinvigorated the entire athletic program. This fall they also made a critical pledge to help construct the Linus Pauling Science Center, a centerpiece initiative in The Campaign for OSU.

The Oregon State University Foundation presented its Lifetime Trustee Award to Martin N. Kelley of Lake Oswego, who was honored at an awards banquet in Rancho Mirage, Calif., on Tuesday, March 4.

The Lifetime Trustee Award is presented to an individual who has demonstrated outstanding service to the university and to the OSU Foundation.

In August 2000, Kelley donated \$20 million for construction of the Kelley Engineering Center, launching the college's drive to become one of the best engineering programs in the nation.

The Oregon State University Alumni Association presented Peter E. Johnson of Corvallis with the Dan Poling Service Award on Tuesday, March 4.

The Dan Poling Service Award recognizes those who have volunteered a significant amount of time to OSU.

Johnson has served as a volunteer leader on a College of Engineering department advisory board, on the college's campaign cabinet, and on the OSU Foundation Board of Trustees.
